5 A Scout is polite to everyone regardless of age or position. He knows that using good manners makes it easier for people to get along. A Scout can be polite even when the other person is wrong or angry. I was **COURTEOUS** when:

6 A Scout knows there is strength in being gentle. He treats others as he wants to be treated. Kindness is not limited to how we feel about people. Be kind to pets and wildlife. Be kind to the earth by protecting natural resources and by using no-trace methods of hiking and camping. I was **KIND** when:

7 A Scout follows the rules of his family, school, and troop. He obeys the laws of his community and country. If he thinks these rules and laws are unfair, he tries to have them changed in an orderly manner rather than disobeying them. I was **OBEDIENT** when:

8 A Scout looks for the bright side of life. He cheerfully does tasks that come his way. He tries to make others happy when he is tired, or even when it is raining outside. Whistling counts! I was **CHEERFUL** when:

9 A Scout works to pay his way and to help others. He saves for the future. He protects and conserves natural resources. He carefully uses time and property. I was **THRIFTY** when:

10 A Scout can face danger although he is afraid. He has the courage to stand against peer pressure for what he thinks is right even if others laugh at him or threaten him. I was **BRAVE** when:
